

How to Become a Referee in AYSO Region 69

Becoming a referee is easy and fun. Most of all as a ref everyone WILL listen to you whether you are right or wrong! (LOL). We will train you, equip you and guide you through the process and, if you are inclined, take you to the higher reaches of reffing. Once you are qualified you can set your own schedule and decide which games to work and who to team-up with.

The process is straightforward, if you haven't done so already, you must:

1. Register as an AYSO volunteer. Go to the AYSO National Site, www.eayso.org <<http://www.eayso.org>> and follow the prompts. Let them know that you are from *Section 1 Area P and Region 69*. You need to register as a volunteer every year.
2. Take a basic referee class. Decide which regional referee class you would like to attend by looking at the schedules on this web site. If there is no information on this site as to an upcoming local class or you are looking for a more convenient time than go to: http://www.ayso76.net/schedules/clinics/index_ayso1p_referees.cfm for information about classes in neighboring regions. Then click on the Lead instructor's name to sign up for the course. When you complete the course you will be given a Regional Badge. Hang on to that, it's your ticket to refereeing.
3. Pick up your referee equipment (shorts, shirt, socks, flags, cards, whistle) from our quartermaster. These items will be distributed at our basic referee class; otherwise you need to make arrangements with the quartermaster for pick-up. Refs must supply their own shoes.
4. Register with our online self-scheduling system. Go to <http://cgisports.com/ref/2131/> and follow the prompts. Once registered with the scheduling system, select your games and ref them.
